Dual Credit Program: Students are enrolled in both post-secondary institutions and high schools concurrently and earn credits towards both a high school diploma and post-secondary degree or diploma.



Dual Credit Programming




- Earn high school and post-secondary credits (transferable)
- Get the support of a high school teacher during first University experience
- Reduce first year course load/reduce the time to complete a program
- Study in an area of passion and interest
- Support successful transition to postsecondary institutions
- Potentially reduce the cost of postsecondary learning











Program Benefits

- Earn 3 post-secondary and 5 -3000 level CTS high school credits

Additional costs are the responsibility of the student and may include:




Sociology Schedule

- No classes the week of March 23, 2020










Sociology Important Dates
